



Through this colaboration citizens can access a wide variety of free digital inclusion programmes and services at their local library.





Over 40 short digital literacy activities covering a range of topics, from beginner computer and mobile device usage to engaging with e-government services and artificial intelligence.

This programme is designed to enhance basic digital skills, empowering individuals to leverage technology for improved daily living and professional development.



Digital Skills test

Tool to assess individual digital proficiency across a 19 digital skills, ranging from digital autonomy and problem solving, to safety and wellbeing. This test helps identify strengths and areas for improvement and provides tailored training recommendations.

This test aims to empower participants to enhance their digital skills, and its agreggated results provide an overview of the city's skill level and progress over time.



Expert-led advocacy talks providing introductory insights into the latest technological trends and discussions. Topics change over time but currently focus on artificial intelligence, fake news, cybersecurity, and parental control.

These talks aim to raise awareness of technological advancements and foster critical thinking and debates, regardless of participants' digital skill levels.




Play-based workshops designed for children aged 6 to 12, aimed at sparking interest in Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics (STEAM).

This program promotes STEAM disciplines from an early age to help address long-term issues of female underrepresentation and the talent gap in the digital economy.


